Manson even oxdered then, to atop in Exgnt of a congxegationat church in South pasadena, whexe Manson startea lookang for the Minhsteq. so that he could kill him and string him upaide down to the cross in front of the church. but it was gortate at maght that the Minister was no Donger there.

When they finally got to the LaBianca houge, after stopping at vaxious other locations Lookjng for people to murder, Manson, by himself, went "nto the LaBianca residence. The Labiancas had just come home from a water skiling trip.
*Manson was armed with a gun. got the drop on them, tied up theim hands but told them that. it was okay, that it was only going to be a robbery.

He Left them then on the - on the sofa. He went out and told Tex watson, Leslie Vantouton and Patricia Krenwinkle to go into the house, but not to cause fear and panic like the niglt befoxe and riot to let the people know that he -- that they vere going to be murdered:

Pr．Shea knew the family and Manson were up to no good and tried to get them thrown off of the ranch，and also Mr．－Mre－Mr．Shea commtted a cardinal sin because he was white and he was married to a bfack woman，and this infurtated．Manson and for both of those reasons he was singled out and killed，and Manson actually participated in the actual murder． inflicting stab wounds to Nx．Shea，

Sax of the nine victats that Manson's Fesporitible for murdering tew murtered in the gupposed sanctlty of thetr own hofes. "And seven of the victins were gonplete stratgerp to hanson. The ony one'g he knew were Hinneman and Shea, and then not even - even that well. He'probably knew shes better than anyone because shea worked out on the - the ranch.
